# Warm Wishes <br> Crib Size Project Linus Pattern 




Warm Wishes first appeared in Quiltmaker's Nov/Dec '03 issue.

This pattern was first introduced in 2000 as the quilt for Project Linus' Make-A-Blanket Day. Numerous Warm Wishes quilts have been distributed to children in need of comfort. We thought you'd enjoy making this easy quilt in a crib size-it's so quick and versatile, you could make one for every season and holiday

## materials for one quilt

Crib: $38^{1 / 2 " x}$ x $491 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Finished Blocks: 51/2"
Novelty Print
$1^{11 / 4}$ yards for blocks
Blue Print
$1 / 2$ yard for blocks
Teal Print
$1 / 2$ yards for blocks
Multiprint 5/8 yard for blocks
Binding $1 / 2$ yard
Backing $15 / 8$ yards
Batting 42" x 53"

## materials for four quilts

To make 4 crib quilts from one queen batting:

## Novelty Print

4 yards for blocks
Blue Print 13/8 yard for blocks
Teal Print
13/8 yards for blocks

## Multiprint

2 yards for blocks
Binding $11 / 2$ yard
Backing $61 / 4$ yards
Batting 90"x 108"

## cutting for each quilt

## Novelty Print

32 squares (A) 6"x 6"
Blue Print
6 strips 2" $\times 40^{\prime \prime}$
Teal Print
6 strips 2"x 40"
Multiprint
6 strips 3" x 40"


Quilting Placement

## About This Quilt

Making this quilt is fast and easy.
We've also included yardage for 4 quilts you can cut 4 crib-size battings from one queen-size batt.

Making the Units and LAssembling the Top
Join the strips to make the bands. Cut the bands into units.


Row 1 Make 5


Assembly

Orienting the units as shown for each row, join the A patches and units to make the row 1's-3's. Sew the rows together in the order shown.

## Z Quilting and Finishing

Layer and baste together the backing, batting and quilt top.

Quilt in the ditch the A patches and units and quilt diagonal lines through the A's. Bind the quilt.

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
